Overview:

The Maintenance and Groundskeeping Engineer is responsible for the upkeep and operation of campground buildings, facilities, equipment, and grounds. They work with a team to ensure all areas are clean, safe, and well-maintained. Duties include troubleshooting and repairing machinery and electrical systems, reading and interpreting technical manuals and blueprints, performing carpentry, electrical, painting, and plumbing tasks, and installing new fixtures and equipment as needed. Additionally, they conduct preventative maintenance and handle guest reguests and work orders efficiently.

The engineer also maintains the outdoor spaces by mowing, raking, pruning, trash removal, watering plants, weeding, cleaning structures, and applying pest control. Proper maintenance of the lawn and equipment is essential, as is collaborating with team members on various tasks like painting, repairing, and debris removal. They must be knowledgeable about how to operate lawnmowers, leaf blowers, and chainsaws safely, and maintain a passion for outdoor work in all weather conditions.

Roles & Responsibilities:

- Perform carpentry, electrical, plumbing, and maintenance/repairs to campground buildings, facilities, equipment, vehicles, and grounds as directed by TJ Potts.
- Comply with all safety programs and guidelines in the operation and storage of equipment, tools, and chemicals.
- Maintain compliance with the preventative maintenance program through regular inspection of facilities, buildings, cabins, vehicles, and equipment, ensuring proper functioning of heating, cooling, ventilation, plumbing, and electrical systems.

- Troubleshoot problems with equipment, determining the best solutions for repair or replacement.
- Install new fixtures, equipment, and appliances as needed.
- Safely operate and maintain the swimming pool and aquatic water features, ensuring proper pool chemistry (will be taught).
- Approach all guest encounters in an attentive, friendly, courteous, and service-oriented manner, prioritizing tasks based on importance and urgency.
- Handle daily lawn care, including mowing, weeding, raking, trimming, watering, and seeding of lawns and shrubbery, as well
 as maintaining garden and landscaping equipment, trucks, golf carts, and power tools.
- Operate and maintain hand tools, such as saws and shovels efficiently, and utilize insecticides, fertilizers, and chemical sprays to treat plant diseases.
- Keep grounds free from trash, litter, and debris, and empty trash receptacles.
- Raking sites after guests depart to keep gravel from grassed areas
- Guide guests to sites via golf cart
- Clean picnic tables, pedestals and sites after guests depart from park
- Touching up with latex paint of sign posts, picnic table canopies, and picnic tables
- Touching up with spray paint of pedestals, picnic tables, fire pits and water hydrants
